Portage County Adult Probation Department Intervention in Lieu of Conviction Special Terms and Conditions

The following are special terms and conditions that shall be followed in addition to the Standard Rules of Probation:

- 1. You can be called in for random drug and/or alcohol screens at any time and must report within a 24 hour period. Additionally, Probation Officers can show up to your residence, at any time, to obtain a drug/alcohol screen.
- 2. You must inform any/all physician(s) or health care providers of your drug/alcohol addiction.
- You must inform your Probation Officer of the names of all of the physicians you are seeing, along with the addresses and phone numbers. You must verify all medications you are prescribed. If, at any time, your prescription medications change, you must inform your Probation Officer immediately.
- 4. If you go or are taken to a hospital or emergency room, you must obtain verification of all medication that you are given and inform your Probation Officer. In addition, it is your responsibility to notify the hospital or doctor of your drug/alcohol addiction.
- 5. If you are being prescribed a prescription that will result in a positive drug screen, your physician will be contacted by the Probation Department to inquire if they are aware of your drug/alcohol addiction and if the drug can be substituted for another drug that will not result in a positive screen.
- 6. If you are being prescribed narcotics, the Probation Department will inquire if the physician can prescribe non-narcotic or non-addictive medication. If the physician feels you must be prescribed narcotics, the Judge will be informed and your case will be referred back to Court for review.
- 7. You are not permitted to take out-dated or left over medication or medication prescribed for alternate purposes. You are only permitted to take current medication that is prescribed to you, as prescribed by your physician and the medication that you informed your Probation Officer. You will not take extra doses or take another person's medication.
- 8. You will attend 12-Step meetings and verify your attendance with your Probation Officer during the entire 12 months you are participating in the Intervention In Lieu of Conviction Program, regardless if you have completed treatment programming.

I have received and read a copy of the Special Terms and Conditions of the Intervention in Lieu of Conviction Program and I have had them explained to me. I understand them and agree to abide by them while being monitored by the Probation Department. Failure to abide by the Special Terms and Conditions may result in my termination from the program.
