ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Portage County Adult Protective Services is tasked with investigating concerns for abuse, neglect, self neglect and exploitation concerns for the vulnerable adults of the county.

The state defines a vulnerable adult as an individual of 60 years and older and is somehow affected by the infirmities of aging. This can include, but not limited to, mental capacity, serious medical conditions, limited mobility or other factors that may impact the adult's capacity.

Portage County Adult Protective Services aims to maximize the independence of vulnerable adults and avoid unnecessary harm or institutionalization.

GOALS OF ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES

To prevent, reduce, or remedy conditions causing endangerment to the older adult by providing necessary services.

To maximize the older adult's independence and self-direction.

To prevent unnecessary institutionalization and enable the older adults to remain in their homes and communities as long as possible.

This can be accomplished by engaging family/friends to help, provide resources and referrals to local agencies for services, and provide short term services ourselves to help the adult go through the process of engaging in services and reduce the risk of them from being harmed.
