
DIVERSION SERVICES PROGRAM

Psychological and Substance Abuse Services

PSYCHOLOGICAL AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES MISSION STATEMENT

The role of Psychological and Substance Abuse Services is to provide the Courts and Detention Center professional clinical and assessment services as a part of the overall rehabilitative effort. To assist in rendering appropriate dispositions that take into consideration the individual needs, characteristics and circumstances of the children in question, the Court orders evaluations to aid in generating case recommendations. It is hoped that by earlier identification of potentially serious offenders, the community can be more effectively protected, while at the same time, by more clearly delineating issues to be addressed as part of a rehabilitative program, more children can be effectively served resulting in less recidivism.

GENERAL SERVICE DESCRIPTION

Psychological and Substance Abuse Services staff conduct evaluations for the Court to assist in generating recommendations for case dispositions. Additional services provided include diagnostic assessments, substance abuse assessments, mental health screening, short term counseling with detained children, consultative services, treatment planning and referral, psychological screening of applicants for employment, and conducting in-service training programs.

PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESSMENTS 2014

In 2014, thirty three (33) children were referred to Psychological Services for evaluation. The assessment process includes parent and child interviews, psychological testing and preparation of a written report. Reports will vary in nature depending on the reason(s) for conducting the assessment and the issues that need to be addressed. The following represents the types of psychological evaluations conducted in 2014.

All children admitted to the Portage/Geauga Detention Center are also screened at the point of intake by Detention Center staff in an effort to identify high risk residents. In addition to direct inquiry into areas related to risk to self and/or others, each child completes a structured questionnaire designed to obtain specific information regarding potential areas of risk. Subsequent to the child's intake and admission all residents (with the exception of weekenders and those released immediately following a preliminary hearing) are interviewed by a qualified mental health professional and a mental status examination is completed. Residents held in detention on a post adjudicatory status are also administered an academic achievement test and often an objective psychodiagnostic personality inventory to further assess for various areas of potential concern, psychological disturbance and/or other rehabilitative needs. Psychological Services staff review all intake and/or assessment materials generated on each resident as part of a coordinated effort to appropriately respond to resident needs/concerns during their period of detention. In 2014, intake reports and assessment materials were reviewed on one hundred and eighty eight (188) new or repeat admissions to the Portage/Geauga Detention Center.

Psychological Services staff are also available to Detention Center staff and residents upon request to provide direct clinical counseling, assessment, and consultative services. In 2014, in addition to reviewing resident intake and assessment materials, Psychological Services staff provided direct clinical counseling/crisis services on an as needed basis to sixty three (63) new and/or repeat residents. The following table provides statistics regarding child assessments and general clinical services provided to residents during 2014 broken down by county.

TREATMENT PLANNING, COORDINATION AND REFERRAL TO LOCAL COUNSELING AGENCIES

In addition to Psychological Services' primary role of conducting assessments and providing clinical counseling and consultative services to the Courts and Detention Center, it frequently acts in a coordinating capacity with other involved agencies. In keeping with the Juvenile Court's goal of minimizing a child's involvement in the legal system, efforts are directed toward providing for the child's rehabilitative needs by utilizing services offered by local child care agencies. Psychological Services staff participate in regularly scheduled inhouse staff meetings for case planning, as well as attend bi-monthly and monthly clinical team meetings to assist in formulating rehabilitative service plans with other involved agencies.

When specific recommendations for treatment are made a part of a case disposition or terms of a child's probation, Psychological Services often assists in initiating the referral process, monitoring and/or tracking progress in treatment, and maintaining appropriate contact with local service providers. The following represents the number of children referred for out-patient treatment services monitored and/or tracked by Psychological Services.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE ASSESSMENTS 2014

The Court's Substance Abuse Services processed one hundred and thirty two (132) referrals for chemical dependency assessments during 2014. Seventy five (75) youths were referred for individual chemical dependency counseling and there were an additional three (3) referrals for intensive outpatient treatment. Three (3) youths were identified as in need of inpatient/residential chemical dependency treatment at the point of assessment and an additional eight (8) youths previously assessed for substance abuse issues were unsuccessful at lower levels of care and ultimately required placement in inpatient/residential treatment programs. Those youth are not reflected in the statistical table below nor are those who were required to complete insight/educational projects prior to case closing.

The following table is a break down, based on referral source, of the total number of assessments conducted, followed by the initial treatment recommendations generated for the different levels of care, and finally some biographical information regarding the children assessed.

Department of Probation Services

The Department of Probation Services consists of two divisions: Intensive Probation and Regular Probation. The staff is responsible for supervising youth and enforcing probation terms. This consists of conducting home, school, and office visits. Both divisions assist youth in meeting treatment needs through the coordination and monitoring of treatment plans.

The Department of Probation Services conducted four (4) Ohio Department of Youth Services evaluations for the Judiciary. A total of two (2) youths were committed to the Ohio Department of Youth Services in the calendar year. One (1) youth was committed to a Community Corrections Facility. The Probation staff administered five hundred and seventy-eight (578) drug screens. Twelve percent (12%) of those screens were positive for at least one drug. Eighty-five percent (85%) of positive drug screens were for marijuana. The remaining positive screens were comprised of cocaine, methamphetamines, amphetamines, opiates, and benzodiazepines. Further seventy-one (71) notices of alleged probation violations were filed. Sixty-three percent (63%) of those notices were drug related.

Of all youth on Probation at the end of 2014, ninety-six percent (96%) were enrolled in school, graduated, obtained a General Equivalency Diploma, or were participating in an alternative educational program. Regular Probation had a rate of ninety-nine percent (99%), while Intensive Probation had a rate of ninety percent (90%). Further, at the end of 2014, youth on Probation who were referred, currently involved, or completed counseling services for mental health and/or substance abuse was ninety-one percent (91%). Regular Probation had a rate of ninety-two percent (92%), while Intensive Probation had a rate of ninety percent (90%).

The Department of Probation Services utilizes a risk assessment tool and written formal case plans. These plans discuss the goals of probation and how the youth will meet those goals. Officers review the case plans with the youth and parent(s) and all parties sign the plan.

The Probation staff is trained in Effective Practices in Community Supervision (EPICS). This is an evidence based program designed to reduce recidivism by addressing the criminal thought behaviors and criminogenic needs of higher-risk offenders.

Regular Probation 2014

The Regular Probation Department is a less structured level of supervision than Intensive Probation. Youth in this program meet weekly with Probation Officers for the first, month of supervision. Staff has the discretion of gradually stepping down the level of supervision dependant upon a child's behavior and progress. Youth in this program have been adjudicated on felony, misdemeanor and unruly offenses.
