Where to see wildflowers

April showers have brought May flowers! Now that spring is finally here, it is the perfect time to get outside and look at what is blooming. Check out these three parks and learn about the spring wildflowers that grow there.

Dix Park

Large White Trillium (*Trillium* grandiflorum): Ohio's state wildflower. Look for the iconic three leaves and petals. White trillium will slowly turn to a pink hue as they age. Trilliums have a long life span: some have been reported to live up to 25 years.



Another common name for the Trillium is Wake Robin.

Yellow Trout-lily (*Erythronium* americanum): This bloom marks the beginning of spring and thousands of tiny plants can cover the forest ground. Look for the yellow, downward facing bloom and mottled green and brown leaves. This plant is also known as Dog's

Tooth Violet, although it is not a true violet.
