# In the Parks

#### Park Levy Issue on November Ballot

The Park District's only property tax levy, which provides 95% of its operating budget, expires at the end of this year. The Park District Board of Commissioners has filed with the Board of Elections to place the issue of a 1 mill levy, comprised of a ½ mill replacement plus an additional ½ mill, on the November 7<sup>th</sup> ballot. The levy would cost the owner of a \$100,000 property \$35/year, or less than \$2.92/month. The funds are critical for operating safe, clean parks and continuing to create and open new parks and trails.

Since 2014, the Park District has added staff, equipment and vehicles, opened 4 new parks, acquired and conserved 1,335 acres, resurfaced 12 miles of hike and bike trail and presented hundreds of free programs for all ages and abilities. Thanks to partnerships, grants and donations, the Park District has been able to stretch levy dollars by bringing in an additional 60 cents for every levy dollar, used to improve and conserve our communities, for generations to come. Let's keep a good thing growing!

## Portage Park District Deer Archery Program

Starting this fall, Portage Park District is initiating a pilot deer archery program, creating opportunities for nine selected hunters to hunt white-tailed deer. The program will occur throughout Ohio's 2023-24 deer archery season, which is September 30, 2023 through February 4, 2024, and adhere to the Ohio Division of Wildlife's 2023-24 Hunting Regulations. The unopened Kent Bog Expansion Preserve in Brimfield Twp. will have five designated areas for hunters. The southern 200-acre portion of Morgan Park, which is separated from the section open to daily use, will provide four designated hunting areas. All members of the public are welcome to apply for an opportunity. Hunters will be selected through a lottery process, with preference given to Portage County residents.

Portage Park District has started its deer archery program as a "pilot" program, meaning it is small scale to allow park staff to evaluate effectiveness and make improvements as needed. Selected hunters will participate in a survey adapted from the Ohio Division of Wildlife's Annual Bowhunter Survey. The survey will generate tallies of the numbers of deer seen and other wildlife spotted while hunting, providing valuable information for Portage Park District's overall natural resources management program. After this season, staff will determine whether and how the public lottery deer archery program will be continued in the future.
