Jack-in-the-Pulpit (*Arisaema triphyllum*)



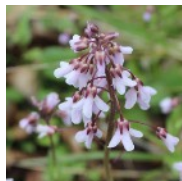

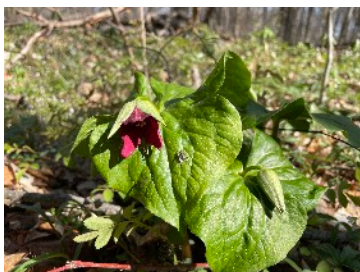
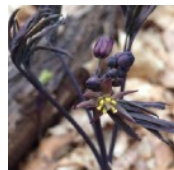
Large-flowered Trillium (*Trillium grandiflorum*)
