

AMENITIES

Trail Lake Park includes trails that travel through a diverse natural landscape. Osprey Loop is an asphalt-paved handicapped-accessible multipurpose trail that loops around the lake and through fields and forest. Kingfisher Way has a rolling topography and includes natural and stone surfaces.

A handicapped-accessible fishing pier and canoe/kayak launch offers catch and keep fishing as well as paddling opportunities.



RULES

- Open dawn to dusk, all year.
- · No horses, no motor vehicles, no swimming
- Leash and pick up after your pet
- Fishing licenses and watercraft registrations are required; see other posted regulations.
- Catch and keep fishing per ODNR guidelines
- No materials, living or nonliving, may be introduced or removed from the park
- Stay on trail. Be safe and courteous to others. Stay to the right, slow down and call out when passing.

ABOUT TRAIL LAKE

Trail Lake Park is 222 acres assembled from four different properties in Streetsboro and Franklin Township, Ohio. Trail Lake was named decades ago in honor of the historic Native American Mahoning Trail that was believed to cross the property on its way from the Ohio River to Lake Erie in Sandusky. Another historic feature is a remnant of the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad that traversed the area. Its most famous passenger was President Abraham Lincoln who passed through the area on his inaugural tour.


NATURAL FEATURES

Trail Lake Park lies within the headwaters area of Tinkers Creek Watershed, the largest tributary to the Cuyahoga River. The park includes mature pine and hardwood forest, wetlands and former fields being restored into native meadows and forest. The 30-acre man-made lake was managed as a fishery to supply bass and bluegill to area restaurants. The lake is also fished by eagles, osprey, belted kingfishers and heron who are joined by many other waterfowl, raptors and songbirds throughout the park, which make it a great place for birdwatching.

The park also helps to buffer the adjacent Herrick Fen State Nature Preserve which is home to a very rare wetland ecosystem with several threatened and endangered species.

Conserving parkland preserves wildlife habitat and protects water quality while reducing stormwater runoff and flood potential.
