Headwaters Trail, Submitted by Jan S.	Vaughn Rd. trailhead to Peck Rd. & back. Smooth, flat, wide multipurpose crushed limestone trail with wonderful scenery.	1.9	1		
Headwaters Trail	Mill St. trailhead (4633 Mill St., Mantua) to Mennonite Rd. & back. Smooth, flat, wide multipurpose crushed limestone trail with wonderful scenery year round.	2.22	1		
Morgan Park	Meadow Trail. Smooth crushed limestone trail that loops through an open meadow with a diverse plant community.	.8	1		
Morgan Park, Submitted by Bill P.	Sassafras Trail. Natural surface trail loops through mature woods and wetlands. Parts of this trail are seasonally wet and muddy.	2.3	2		
The Portage Hike & Bike Trail	Cleveland Road trailhead to Redbrush Road & back. Flat, asphalt paved trail built on the historic Erie rail line.	3.8	1		
The Portage Hike & Bike Trail	Franklin Connector. Begin at trailhead, hike to Spell Rd. and back. Flat, asphalt paved trail.	2.6	1		
Seneca Ponds Park, Submitted by Nancy S.	Beaver Trail. Natural surface trail loops through the woods and around the pond with some boardwalk sections, benches, and fishing access.	.73	2		
Shaw Woods Park	Buckeye Loop. Natural surface trail guides visitors from the parking lot into the mature woods with scenic overlooks. Seasonally wet in some areas.	.69	2		
Shaw Woods Park, Submitted by Craig L.	Meander Trail. Natural surface trail loops through mature woods and wetlands, along the West Branch of the Mahoning River, and over headwater streams. Seasonally wet in some areas.	1.69	3		
Towner's Woods Park	Ski Trail. High and low undulating natural surface trail is the most traveled and challenging path for cross country skiers. Winds through mature woods and the heart of the park.	2.1	3		
Towner's Woods Park, Submitted by Craig L.	Butterfly Trail. A natural surface, grassy trail loops through meadows and early successional forest. Prime location to spot native plants, flowers, insects, butterflies and moths in warm months.	1.2	1
