### **Message from the Director**

The Portage County Regional Planning Commission (RPC) had an unusual year in 2020; as did most everyone else. The COVID-19 pandemic encouraged us to work both in the office and from home. Our public meetings like most everyone else were done via Zoom or Microsoft Team meetings. We were coming off a solid 2019 and full of high hopes to push forward our Parks and Recreation, Chamber of Commerce and Historic Structures and Places story maps. The pandemic added a great deal of uncertainty with how the world would adjust and operate. We decided to hold off on collecting from local businesses related to the Chambers and private recreation businesses since many were greatly affected by the outbreak.

In the midst of all this we added a shared grant writer and we also had help from an intern and part-time staff to keep the office functions rolling.

We were able to receive additional grant funding for a variety of projects which helped our funding improve from past years. Funding is always challenging, but we are working to find more consistent funding sources that we can rely on year to year. The RPC continues to make strides in community collaboration and guiding member communities to meet their needs. We continue to provide zoning and mapping needs for our members, process countywide subdivision reviews, administer CDBG grants on the behalf of the County Commissioners, and write multiple grants for our member communities. Other activities included fair housing calls, attending member zoning commission meetings (zoom or in person) per their request, and assisting with mapping data

as requested. We also sit on several boards representing Portage County in a local and regional setting.

Some exciting projects that occurred in 2020:

**RPC worked on the Brimfield Comprehensive Plan**: The Brimfield Comprehensive Plan was an update to their 1988 plan which had a minor update in 2004. This plan included surveys from approximately 500 participants, a hands-on department meeting with the Brimfield Trustees and department heads.

RPC is updating the Subdivision Regulations which will be completed in 2021. The Subdivision Regulations have not had a major amendment in more than three decades and those agencies that implement the subdivision regulations, including the Great Akron Homebuilders Association and others have provided valuable insight into the process.

Several projects that were ready to roll like the Chamber of Commerce story maps, and Local Historical Structures story maps were placed on hold while both communities and businesses dealt with the COVID-19 health crisis.

Looking ahead to 2021, we seek to restart and build on the accomplishments of the last couple years. We are looking forward to working on the County's first Comprehensive Plan and County Vision Plan. We are actively seeking grant funding opportunities on behalf of our communities and for projects that will benefit our residents. We will be taking a long-view of how the RPC staff can best serve our member communities. We are re-evaluating staff strengths and weaknesses and charting a path that propels our agency and communities forward. I would like to thank all of our community members for their support and for their desire to make their communities and Portage County a greater place for us all to enjoy.





### **Community Development**

PCRPC administered \$715,907.33 in CDBG Community Development Grant Program funds for the Portage County Board of Commissioners with the following results:

#### 2018 CDBG Allocation Grant

- Construction was completed to run 395 linear feet of waterline that enabled the Ravenna Head Start facility, located at 4833 Harding Avenue in Ravenna Township to tap into the City of Ravenna's water system.
- In conjunction with the 2019 CHIP and the 2018 CDBG Allocation Grant Fair Housing assistance was provided to 53 households within Portage County excluding the City of Kent. Provided educational materials regarding fair housing to 10 agencies/organizations/public events and provided training to 11 agencies/ organizations.




- Construction of the following was completed on Vine and Gill Street in the City of Ravenna:
  - 1. 1,560 linear feet of waterline was replaced.
  - 2. Six catch basins were installed.
  - 3. Three manholes.
  - 725 linear feet of sidewalk was replaced and upgraded to ADA guidelines.
  - 5. 1,750 linear feet of concrete curb was replaced.
  - 6. 1,580 linear feet of asphalt resurfacing was completed.
  - 7. Three fire hydrants were installed.

### 2020 CDBG Allocation Grant

 Prepared and submitted application for the 2020 CDBG Community Development Grant Program to provide services for LMI Portage County Households and/or eliminate a slum and blight.



### **Committees**

### **Celebrate Portage!**

The RPC is a core participant in **Celebrate Portage!**, which is a grassroots effort to prepare a countywide vision plan. The 2020 Celebrate Portage events and activities were delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and are expected to resume in Fall 2021.

### **Member Projects**

### **Brimfield Township Land Use Plan**

Regional Planning is updating the Brimfield Township Land Use Plan with current maps and conditions assessments, demographics, public input, and recent accomplishments by the Township. The goals, objectives, and strategies are being updated to reflect current trends and needs. The plan includes responsible partners and agencies that would be involved with implementing the plan; as well as, a thorough review of the land use and zoning as part of the update. The Land Use Plan will be completed in the Spring of 2021.

### **Zoning Resolutions and Mapping**

Several communities have revised zoning resolutions and updated zoning maps to reflect recent development trends and to prepare their communities for future development. We did several map amendments throughout 2019.



### **Grants**

### **Ohio Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails** Grant

In February 2020, Atwater Township received \$53,595 to continue making improvements to the Old School Park. Atwater Township was able to construct a trail around the perimeter of the park with grant funds.

### **U.S. Department of Justice Adult Drug Court and Veterans Treatment Court Discretionary Grant Program**

In October 2020, the Common Pleas Court received \$492,782 for the existing Help, Opportunity and Progress through Education (HOPE) Drug Court, and the Municipal Court received \$492,782 to create Recovery Inspiring Success through Engagement (RISE) Drug Court. With just under \$1 million in total funding, the implementation and enhancement of the drug courts will allow additional options for defendants in hopes of decreasing recidivism.

### Office of Criminal Justice Services Coronavirus Emergency **Supplemental Funding Grant**


In July 2020, Adult Probation applied for the Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Grant to help offset the cost of keeping probation officers and clients safe during the pandemic. The request has been partially funded, and \$53,623.17 is pending.

### **Grant Writing for Community Partners**


In a unique collaboration, RPC joined with County Engineers, Job and Family Services, and Water Resources to fund a shared grant writer, Kailey McMullen. Although 2020 was an unprecedented year, Kailey was able to assist in bringing approximately \$2.8 million to Portage County and assist the partners in a variety of ways. They include helping Water Resources to secure a loan of \$1.7 million through the Water Supply Revolving Loan Account; assisting with updating Subdivision Regulations; assisting County Engineers with Ohio Public Works Commission applications; and working with Job and Family Services to identify and apply for grant funds.
