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# Help finding the workers you need

OhioMeansJobs Portage County can help you find the workers you need with job posting assistance, career and hiring events, and sample job applications and want ads.

Employers can post their own job directly at OhioMeansJobs.com. Account registration is required and you will need your FEIN (Federal Employer Identification Number) and State of Ohio Tax Withholding Account Number.

Besides posting jobs, you can also search resumes and access labor market information.

OMJ Portage County's Business Services staff can also post the job for you. Email the listing to PORTAGE\_RECRUITER2@jfs.ohio.gov. We will share the posting via email blasts and other outreach at no cost. The posting also goes to a national job search aggregator where it's visible nationwide.

## Help with training and talent development

OhioMeansJobs Portage County (OMJPC) offers on-site computer training labs and conference space. We offer referrals to local employee training providers, and we can connect employers with other training programs.

On-the-Job Training is a federally-funded program that pays up to half a trainee's wages for up to six months of training to encourage long-term employment. Find out more about it <a href="here">here</a>.

# Help selecting candidates

OhioMeansJobs Portage County (OMJPC) can screen qualified applicants. Our business services team also tests aptitude for job readiness and assesses skills.

We host a job fair in November with on-site interviewing or virtual hiring with Premier Virtual software.

OMJPC collaborates with local schools to provide career-readiness programs for students where employers can share expertise.

We also participate in <u>OhioMeansSkills</u>, an effort to help employers find and retain workers with the skills they need utilizing ACT WorkKeys. In addition, we support hiring special populations including migrant and seasonal workers, older workers, veterans, youth, and workers with disabilities.

#### Help accessing benefits

OMJPC can apprise you of opportunities to access funding and tax credit opportunities.

Apprenticeship programs may qualify for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds and/or the federal Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC).

WOTC credits are available to employers who hire individuals from eligible target groups.

OhioMeansAccessibility encourages employers to consider hiring workers with disabilities. Not only does this enhance workplace diversity, it can also create opportunities to earn tax credits. #### Human Resources Management and Planning Support

OhioMeansJobs Portage County (OMJPC) offers resources for small businesses and entrepreneurs, including human resource workshops and services to help support and retain employees.

# Rapid Response & Layoff Aversion

Rapid Response is a proactive, business-focused and flexible strategy designed primarily to respond to layoffs and plant closings by quickly coordinating services and providing immediate aid to companies and their affected workers. We meet with workers at your facility or the OhioMeansJobs Center in Ravenna to explain options and help get them re-employed.

Businesses that lay off 50 or more workers are subject to Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification (WARN) rules. More information is available here.

## Labor Market and Workforce Data

Data collected by the <u>Bureau of Labor Market</u> <u>Information</u> can help you make good business decisions, develop job descriptions, and assess wage trends.

The Bureau collects and analyzes information about industries, occupations and employment.

It also provides an economic profile for every Ohio County, which indicates a county's top employing industries. In <a href="Portage County">Portage County</a>, they are Manufacturing, Educational Services, and Health Care and Social Assistance.

The <u>workforce supply tool</u> also tracks graduates from in-demand occupations and provides job opening information by occupation and wage.

#### **OMJ Readiness Seal**



OMJPC can provide you assurance that high school students are prepared to contribute to the workplace and their communities.

When a student demonstrates they have the personal strengths, strong work ethic, and professional experience businesses need, they receive the OhioMeansJobs *Readiness Seal*, a formal designation on their high school diplomas and transcripts.

## **Ohio Business Gateway**

Ohio businesses can use the Ohio Business Gateway to access services and submit transactions and payments with many state agencies.

The gateway offers the ability to:

- File and pay sales tax and use tax
- Register for, file, and pay Commercial Activity Tax
- File unemployment compensation tax
- Register for a vendor's license

# Hiring Specific Populations

There are programs available to support business growth through the hiring of specific populations:

- HIRE Vets Medallion Program: The only federal-level veterans' employment award that recognizes a company or organization's commitment to veteran hiring, retention, and professional development. Learn more <a href="here">here</a>.
- Businesses can reduce their tax burden by hiring restored, or formerly incarcerated, citizens.
